Trusting God: The Faithful Service of Dean Hoffman

They asked me to park in the grass. And when I entered the church, I discovered that the receiving line extended out of the sanctuary, into the foyer, and nearly down the basement stairs! Every seat in the sanctuary was full, and a substantial crowd of late-comers was being seated in another building to watch the funeral on close-circuit TV. Special music at the service was brought by the three men who have constituted the Couriers, Central Pennsylvania's most famous gospel singing group, for the past fifty years. The deceased was a friend of theirs, it turned out. But, as I could see, he was a friend of very many people.

Dean Hoffman, a long-time board member and friend of Rhodes Grove, passed away rather unexpectedly in July, and I had the opportunity to attend his funeral at the Idaville United Brethren Church a few days later. I was not entirely surprised by either the size of the crowd I encountered or the kind of tributes given about Dean that day. Dean's style was low-key; he was not charismatic, not an up-front kind of guy. But he had very broad shoulders, a very big heart, an incredible amount of knowledge, an enormous capacity for service, and a tremendous faith. It's the combination that makes people sit up and take notice, and show up to say thanks.

It's the faith that will remain his legacy, I suspect. I served on several boards with Dean over the past several decades (is there a ministry board on which Dean did *not* serve?) He was often originally



placed there because of his banking experience; Dean knew finances, and that's a skill that boards are eager to have. But Dean stayed on those boards because he knew God. Simply put, Dean trusted God...with his heart and his life, with his family and his friends, with his church and his charities, with his money and his mouth. And whenever any of the rest of us would hit the panic button, Dean was there, in his quiet and confident manner, to remind us that this was God's ministry, and that we should trust God to take care of things. And, of course, Dean was always proved right.

Dean is gone now...how shall we ever replace him? What will we ever do without him? Oh, yes, that's right...we will do what Dean suggested all along: We'll trust God.

This summer, I have been encouraged by the focus of the camping programs for 2010, "The Pursuit."


"Flee the evil desires of youth, and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart." 2 Tim. 2:22

I know that the campers were challenged with turning away from the things that we constantly face, that should we choose, would not be pleasing to God. Pursuing God-pleasing activities is what Rhodes Grove Camp is all about.

The Rhodes Grove Board of Directors has also been in pursuit of initiatives that would be pleasing to God. To name a few, would be the formulation of a Master Campus Plan, a Risk Management Plan, and a plan that would secure the financial future of the Camp. The Directors and Staff are always looking for ways to develop resources for the Camp, in terms of human resources, the physical plant of the camp, and of course financial resources; all for the Glory and Honor of God.

One initiative that is already underway is the renovation of the "C-Row" and "D-Row" Cabins. Two of the duplex cabins have been completed and one duplex cabin is partially finished. There are many more to be done, at a cost of about \$7,000 per duplex. The renovations include new roofing, new exterior siding, and new interior pine-wood wall surfacing. The cabins will be outfitted





with a microwave oven and a newer refrigerator. The Camp has been blessed with construction-skilled volunteers to perform the work that has been completed. The Board of Directors is encouraging everyone to join us in this endeavor by contributing funds for the purchase of materials, or by assembling a team of skilled volunteers. Most of all, we ask that you include

this project in your prayers, for the safety of the volunteers and that God will utilize the renovated cabins to further his Kingdom.

On a personal note, as time allows, I will be pursuing the answer to a couple of questions that have been on my mind. One, are there more stinkbugs than ladybugs? Second, do ladybugs stink worse than stinkbugs? And lastly, which is more delectable, stinkbug pâté or ladybug pâté? I might see if the Rhodes Grove Food Service Division can help me out on the last one.

CAKE

Moist Chocolate Cake

2 Cups Flour 3/4 Cup Milk

2 Cups Sugar 3/4 Cup Vegetable Oil

3/4 Cup Cocoa 2 Eggs

2 tsp. Baking Soda 1 Cup Brewed Coffee

1 tsp. Baking Powder 1 tsp. Vanilla

1/2 tsp. Salt

Combine dry ingredients in mixing bowl. Add milk, oil, eggs and vanilla all at once. Beat well. Add coffee. Mixture will be very runny! Pour into greased 9x13 cake pan.

Bake 350 degrees for 35-45 minutes or till middle springs back.

Great with peanut butter icing! Serves 15



Pumpkin Dip

4 Cups 10X Sugar

2 8 oz. Packages Cream Cheese

1 30 oz. Can Pumpkin

2 tsp. Ground Cinnamon

1 tsp. Ground Ginger

In a large mixing bowl combine sugar and cream cheese, beating until well blended. Beat in remaining ingredients. Store in airtight container in fridge. Serve with apple slices, pear slices, grapes, pretzels sticks and gingersnaps. Yield: 7 Cups


Calvary Presbyterian and Korean Presbyterian followed the Mid-Atlantic District for a combined total of 115 youth and leaders.
