


From the Director's Desk (Continued)

blessed Rhodes Grove over five


weeks of summer camp with an enthusiastic summer ministry team, powerful speakers who brought Gods Holy Word, and loads of energetic campers.


Cabin Refurbishment Update








Growing the Grove
