## From the Directors Desk



As I write this, Family Camp has just ended. We had a wonderful opportunity to sit under the teaching of Bill Mummert, pastor of Gettysburg Baptist Church. He spoke of vision, recognizing a vision for ourselves individually, for our

families generationally, and for our churches corporately. I was inspired to reflect on the vision for Rhodes Grove and what that means for all of us who know and love this ministry. Rhodes Grove has a mission of advancing our Christian community through offering experiential camping programs, Biblically based educational opportunities and full service retreats all in a naturally pleasing environment. Rhodes Grove is offering 9 camping program opportunities over the course of 4 weeks and we are excited about the number of students who have registered so far. We have a young, vibrant, energetic staff to minister to the many souls that will be on our campus this summer. I am pleased to report that many of our summer staff members are returning from last year and we have hired a few new counselors as well! We will be encouraging our campers to “flee evil desires ...and to pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart.” - 2 Timothy 2:22

As we wait for the blessed first day of summer camp to arrive, we will continue to prepare by readying our staff for registration day and the abundance of campers that will be arriving. ## Rhodes Grove

### ***A lesson in history***

In 1898 the Pennsylvania Conference of the United Brethren in Christ Church first applied for the use of the Rhodes Grove land to host a summer camp meeting. The owners of the land, Mr. & Mrs. W. Lee Rhodes, lived a short distance away to the south, along the Pennsylvania Railroad. This family also owned the farm which later housed the Milton Wright Memorial Home just across the field from the Rhodes Grove.

The first services held by the United Brethren in Christ Church at Rhodes Grove were facilitated by a simple roofed structure over the speaker's platform. The audience was seated on planks supported at either end by a short post in the ground. A few of the more enterprising folks brought tents for overnight shelter but the majority found a place to stay as best they could. Due to limited traveling options, only the few living a short distance away were able to travel home between services.

As the First World War was coming to a close, the conference decided to build permanent structures on the grounds. In 1917 they purchased the land from the Rhodes family heirs for \$4,000. That same year a 100

X 150 foot tabernacle was built along with a dining hall, both for the sum of \$6,000.

As folks caught a vision for

what the camp could be they built additional structures. Starting in 1934 summer cottages were built on the grounds. Some were privately built and owned while the camp constructed a row of cottages to the West of the Tabernacle.

### ***Restoring a piece of history***

These cottages that remain on the grounds of Rhodes Grove are in need of some tender, loving care. The Rhodes Grove Board of Directors has approved an initiative to bring restoration to this piece of Rhodes



Grove history. Our Church of the Brethren friends have come alongside of Rhodes Grove to begin the project. During the week of April 19, 2010, a mission's project was begun and the exterior of Cabins C7 and C8 were refurbished by adding a new roof and new siding. These cabins also received a new coat of paint on all other exposed surfaces. The exterior of Cabins



D8 and D9 received a few repairs and a fresh coat of paint also. The interiors of these cabins are receiving a much needed face lift in the form of updated wiring and updated furnishings when needed. The walls are being finished with insulation and an application of pine wood

wall covering to streamline the look of our cabins alongside Kauffman Lodge and the Retreat Center. These updates will allow these rarely used gems to be placed back into service for the months of April through October. There are plenty of opportunities for you to get involved with this action plan! Rhodes Grove is accepting donations of materials, labor, time and finances. ## Yahweh God of the Pentateuch

**August 23-26, 2010**

**9:30 am-12:00 noon**

*Bible Study with Bob Conway*

This course digs into the first five books of the Bible in a distinctive way to discover its main character – Yahweh God. Our ultimate goal should be to know God; everything else is secondary! If we want to know God, we begin at the beginning with the Pentateuch. Herein, we discover the One who is tender and terrifying. He is a friend or foe – blessing or cursing, redeeming or judging His creation man based on His promises and commands.

Yahweh God's lofty nature, character and personality soar from every page. Just when we think we have God figured out, His words or actions surprise us; yet we find that Yahweh remains consistent – true and righteous in everything He does.

The Pentateuch is a preparatory foundation for the study of Scripture with Yahweh God as the primary subject. The biblical characters (Adam, Eve, Noah, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Pharaoh, the Egyptians, Israelites and many others) provide the background for understanding and knowing Him.

Upon completion of this course, the students should be able to:

1. Identify the diverse sides of Yahweh God's character and personality.
2. Apply the foundational truths about Yahweh God to the rest of the Bible.
3. Appreciate their own relationship with Yahweh God in a deeper way.

These course objectives will be realized through interactive lectures taught by Bob Conway, graduate of Grace Theological Seminary, retired pastor, and currently a teacher at Jamaica Bible College. One CEU will be given upon completion for those who register to take the course for credit. *Yahweh God of the Pentateuch*, the study book for the course is \$10. Registration for a CEU is not necessary to participate in the study.
