Rhodes Grove has had a very exciting year thus far. We have experienced some wonderful opportunities to minister to our community by providing a safe, family friendly, God honoring environment.

This year, Rhodes Grove introduced an event specifically for women. A Ladies tea was planned for May. The women present were so blessed by the opportunity to attend that a second tea was planned for September. This event saw 80 guests in May blossom into 160 women attending in September to enjoy a break from everyday life and come together with nothing more to do than be encouraged and enjoy the companionship of other women.

Family camp allowed whole family ministry. Family camp saw children cheering while learning that Jesus loves them. Family camp saw youth connecting on a personal level with their peers. Family camp witnessed the blessing of seeing a marriage restored that was a breath away from dissolving. Family camp witnessed families worshiping together, laughing together, playing together and growing together.

Rhodes Grove summer camp witnessed 350 children on campus to hear and learn more of Jesus Christ. 42 of these children made life changing decisions for Christ during their week of camp. 30 of the campers that came to Rhodes Grove came because of the benefit of the campership program. Without this subsidy, these children would not have had the opportunity to experience camp this summer.

Rhodes Grove has been the destination of choice for a large number of retreat groups this year as well. We have provided a Christian environment for a variety of ministry groups to bring their people to hear the message of Jesus Christ.

Rhodes Grove initiated a leadership training program for Senior High youth. The CLP program began in September and will continue throughout the school year. This program will allow interested youth the opportunity to be discipled while learning more about Rhodes Grove and the prospect of serving as summer camp staff.

In addition to our 2011 youth summer camp program....from June 17 through August 10, Rhodes Grove served 678 youth and leaders from a variety of different backgrounds and ethnicities. Numbers for youth conferences were a bit reduced this year...but the enthusiasm was not! Kids young and old love to come to Rhodes Grove. A few highlights include the use of our facilities for Child Evangelism Fellowship (CEF) to train the next generation to reach children with the Good News of Jesus Christ. Tuscarora Catholic, Korean Presbyterian, Capital Vietnamese Christian Fellowship, Fellowship Bible, Mid Atlantic District of the Nazarene, and Calvary Presbyterian all retreated again at Rhodes Grove and enjoyed times of great worship, great food, and

As we move into the fall conference schedule, I thought you would enjoy hearing a recent testimony from Amy Hammond of Cedar Grove Women's Ministry. Rhodes Grove Welcomes a New Program Director






